

Welcome to Paderborn!

Paderborn is not only geographically located in the middle of the Paderborner Land, the university city with more than 150,000 inhabitants is also the economic and cultural centre of an area that extends far beyond the borders of the Paderborner Land. Thanks to enormous development in recent decades, Paderborn today presents itself as a lively but still manageable large city with a high quality of life and great recreational value. Guests visiting Paderborn for the first time are often pleasantly surprised by the attractive city centre with its numerous sights, its romantic alleys, the attractive pedestrian zone and the 200 springs of the Pader, Germany's shortest river.

A real feast for the eyes is the former prince-bishop's residence, Schloss Neuhaus, with its baroque palace garden. Surrounded by a moat, the Weser Renaissance palace is the centre of the „Paderborn Palace Summer“ every year from May to October with a variety of events - this year including the rescueDAYS.



A PORTRAIT OF THE PADERBORN FIRE BRIGADE

The Paderborn Fire Brigade is a voluntary fire brigade with full-time staff and forms an independent department of the Paderborn city administration. Approximately 270 full-time colleagues and 400 members of the volunteer fire brigade are currently active in preventive and defensive fire protection and in rescue services in a total of 10 fire brigades. The full-time firefighters man the two fire and rescue stations, North and South, as well as the Schloss Neuhaus rescue station. A total of 39 functions are provided in 24 hours. In addition to the emergency service, the Paderborn Fire Brigade also runs a state-approved rescue service school, where about 30 emergency paramedics are currently being trained. In addition, the Paderborn Fire Department conducts basic group leader courses on behalf of the IDF. In 2021, a total of 15,561 RTW, 5,502 NEF, 5,502 KTW, 11,519 fire protection and 1,913 assistance missions were handled by the Paderborn Fire Department.


Parking: Please use the parking lot P1 of the stadium, home deluxe arena.



A LOOK BACK: RESCUE DAYS 2019 IN MOSBACH

For four days, everything revolved around technical rescue on the grounds of the Training Center Retten und Helfen (TCRH) in Mosbach. In addition to the familiar training stations such as truck rescue, new vehicle technology or car on barrier, the approximately 700 participants were also able to practice at a completely new station - initial securing of building after traffic accident. Three different scenarios presented the firefighters with new challenges here, including rescuing an injured person from a car that was buried under a collapsed bridge.

„A great event with huge profit! Great exchange with others, fun factor also very big. Super to be allowed to practice on zero series vehicles as well. Many thanks!“, said one participant after the event on Sunday evening. Speaking of zero series vehicles: These were provided by Mercedes, Renault, BMW, VW and MAN.

After a break of several years, the rescueDAY symposium also took place again this year. Here, well-known representatives from the firefighting scene reported on their experiences in the areas of electromobility, modern vehicle technology and practical accident rescue.

The cooperation with the Neckar-Odenwald district fire brigade association and the TCRH, without which an event of this size would not be possible, worked excellently and contributed a great deal to the success of the event. A big thank you also goes to the many volunteers!



A LOOK AHEAD: RESCUE DAYS 2023 AT BOSTALSEE (SAARLAND)

In the middle of the Saar-Hunsrück Nature Park and on the edge of the Hunsrück-Hochwald National Park lies the Sankt Wendeler Land, one of the most beautiful regions in Saarland. The district of St. Wendel, located in the north of the state, consists of seven municipalities and the city of St. Wendel. The current population is around 88,500 and it has a total area of 476.12 km².

Already in 2018 we were allowed to accompany the rescueDAYS at the Bostalsee. The 120 hectare Bostalsee with its over 60,000 m² event area offers excellent conditions for the rescueDAYS 2023 as well. In addition to the training event, the Fire Brigade Days of the district will take place for the fourth time under the auspices of the Förderverein der Feuerwehren im Landkreis. In addition to the rescueDAYS, a trade fair with over 100 exhibitors will also be held at the same time.

The management conference of the Saarland with more than 300 participants with expert lectures will be held on Saturday in the large marquee. In addition to the fire departments of the district, THW, DRK, Malteser, DLRG, emergency medical services, the German Federal Armed Forces, state and federal police will also participate in the event and take advantage of the opportunity to present themselves.

We look forward to welcoming you to therescueDAYS 2023 at the Bostalsee.
